Please have the following items
so your experience will be
successful:

- A small tub/bowl to soak weavers.
- Small paring knife, awl, clippers or scissors.
- An apron and lap hand towel(s)
- About 4 tule rods about 12" long 12 tule rods about 24" long, both 1/4 to 3/8" thick at base.
- Additional 20 tule about 24-32" in length, for your weavers.
- 2 very thin weavers about 32" long
- Measure from the tip.

The class will be outside, so dress for the heat. Bring a lawn chair.
